

Steady progress continues towards implementation of the new Aged Care Quality Standards. To facilitate consumer engagement we have had location changes within Violet Town Nursing Home. The Lifestyle Team have relocated to Grevillea utilising the office at the end of the east corridor as a store room and the small sitting room as here activity centre. This seems to be a positive move with residents form Grevillea, River Gum and Blue Wren sharing the space and getting to know one another well. The office space vacated by the Lifestyle Team is now a consultation room for residents and family and/or their representative to have admission interviews, care planning review discussions and consultation with Nursing Staff regarding residents' health and well-being. This room is also able to be used for family members during end-of life vigil for time out to collect their thoughts and have a cup of tea/coffee. The store room vacated by the Lifestyle Team has reverted back to an overnight stay room that can be utilised by family, staff and students.

Our Care Recipient Information Book has been reviewed and updated to reflect changes to the standards and Home Care and Community Care are making steady progress towards updating their respective information books.

A resident focus group concerning Meal Satisfaction was commenced earlier this year and continues with monthly meetings with a resident representative reporting back to resident meeting.

The flu season is here again with an increase in the number of confirmed cases of influenza Australia wide. Both staff and residents are being immunised across both campus and we ask that family and friends who are feeling unwell do not attend the facility if feeling unwell. Remember that the best way to stop an outbreak is by prevention. Hand hygiene is the first step in prevention. Please use hand gel provide in entry foyers on entering and leaving the Nursing Home.

Quality Coordinator (contd)

Education of staff continues with a recent Dementia Essentials course held in April. Our lifestyle/activities Coordinator has recently attended a 'Cameron Camp Masterclass Engaging residents and staff using the Montessori Inspired Lifestyle' which is incorporated in to the activities plan. Our registered nursing staff and activities staff are attending CPR and first aid training on site in May and End of Life Care education in May.

Violet Town Nursing Home is currently hosting a number of students from GOTAFE and La Trobe University. The students are undertaking Certificate IV in Lifestyle and Well-being and Batchelor of Nursing Transition to Registered Nursing placement. We also have a traineeship in Certificate 111 in Individual Health and student placement through Euroa Secondary College.

Our volunteers for the Tuesday morning wheelchair walking group are still doing a wonderful job wheeling our residents around Violet Town. The facility have recently purchased orange safety vests for the safety of our volunteers and residents

We currently hold 16 Home Care Packages and provide in-home services to some of these clients. Four of our current Level 2 packages are on the waiting list for a higher package and have been for some time.

We advertise through local newspapers and Community sites and continue to do community talks on Aged Care as required.
